**PERSONALCARE PHYSICIANS AND MIRACLES FOR KIDS TEAM UP TO PROVIDE
FREE PRIVATE PRIMARY MEDICAL CARE TO OC FAMILIES IN NEED**

*New Miracles for Kids FamilyCare Program to provide 40 family members
with personal concierge care to oversee all aspects of medical care.*

TUSTIN, CALIF. (June 16, 2011) – [Miracles for Kids](#), a non-profit organization based in Tustin, CA, announced today through an exclusive partnership with [Personalcare Physicians](#) in Newport Beach the charity has launched the Miracles for Kids FamilyCare Program that will provide free primary medical care for 40 family members who are part of the Miracles for Kids Grant Program, which operates at Children’s Hospital of Orange County (CHOC Children’s).

The Grant Program was launched to address the numerous financial needs of families with a child in treatment, including rent or mortgage costs, transportation, insurance co-payments and physician bills.

“Personalcare Physicians is very excited to be able to provide concierge medical services to these families who are so in need during their time of crisis,” said Troy Medley, chief executive officer for Personalcare Physicians. “This will be an expressly rewarding opportunity for our physicians who all chose to become family doctors and be a part of this concierge practice because they really want to care for and personally connect with their patients. Now, to be able to help families in this manner who could not otherwise afford medical care is something really special for them.”
